Another one to watch out for! Your child may receive a message about a poll where someone has voted for them, please educate them NOT to click and have a look. This app says it has an age rating of 13 however, there is no age verification when you sign up. Once you have joined up, the app uses the GPS on your phone to show users all the primary and secondary schools in the local area, as well as how many students in those schools are signed up, and the app then allows you to connect to 'my school', one on-line expert had access to this information as a 51 year old!! Notably, the primary schools seemed to have more users than the secondary schools.

Without taking part in any polls, you receiving notifications stating that someone has picked you in a poll– this is meant to make you click on the app. If you have completed a poll you are then invited to play again, but you have to either wait an hour or invite friends, which means giving access to your contacts and sending an alert to others. This creates curiosity (what am I missing out on?)- a very persuasive device indeed.

As of 2023, anime is a truly colossal market, estimated to be worth a total of \$28.61 billion in its entirety, with somewhere around 300 separate shows and films being created in the last year alone. Many have applauded anime as an industry for its willingness to take risks in its storytelling, with the best examples of the genre creating something truly unique and beautiful, with genuine artistic value.
